**First Reading**      *Nehemiah 8:1-3, 5-6, 8-10*

*First Reader*      A reading from the book of the prophet Nehemiah

All the people gathered together into the square before the Water Gate. They told the scribe Ezra to bring the book of the law of Moses, which the Lord had given to Israel. Accordingly, the priest Ezra brought the law before the assembly, both men and women and all who could hear with understanding. This was on the first day of the seventh month. He read from it facing the square before the Water Gate from early morning until midday, in the presence of the men and the women and those who could understand; and the ears of all the people were attentive to the book of the law. And Ezra opened the book in the sight of all the people, for he was standing above all the people; and when he opened it, all the people stood up. Then Ezra blessed the Lord, the great God, and all the people answered, 'Amen, Amen', lifting

up their hands. Then they bowed their heads and worshipped the Lord with their faces to the ground. So they read from the book, from the law of God, with interpretation. They gave the sense, so that the people understood the reading. And Nehemiah, who was the governor, and Ezra the priest and scribe, and the Levites who taught the people said to all the people, ‘This day is holy to the Lord your God; do not mourn or weep.’ For all the people wept when they heard the words of the law. Then he said to them, ‘Go your way, eat the fat and drink sweet wine and send portions of them to those for whom nothing is prepared, for this day is holy to our Lord; and do not be grieved, for the joy of the Lord is your strength.’





*Deacon* A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew.

Immediately Jesus made the disciples get into the boat and go on ahead to the other side, while he dismissed the crowds. And after he had dismissed the crowds, he went up the mountain by himself to pray. When evening came, he was there alone, but by

this time the boat, battered by the waves, was far from the land, for the wind was against them. And early in the morning he came walking towards them on the lake. But when the disciples saw him walking on the lake, they were terrified, saying, 'It is a ghost!' And they cried out in fear. But immediately Jesus spoke to them and said, 'Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid.' Peter answered him, 'Lord, if it is you, command me to come to you on the water.' He said, 'Come.' 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## Renewal of Baptismal Covenant and Ordination Vows

*The Designated Lay Person for the Renewal Rite responds on behalf of the people. Others respond while muted.*

*Bishop* Dear friends, the ministry we share is none other than the sacrificial ministry of Christ, who gave himself up to death on the cross for the salvation of the world. By his glorious resurrection he has opened for us the way of everlasting life. By the gift of the Holy Spirit he shares with us the riches of his grace.

The duty of all Christians is to follow Christ; to come together week by week for corporate worship; and to work, pray, and give for the spread of the kingdom of God. Affirming that duty, I invite you to reaffirm your own Baptismal Covenant.

*Bishop* Do you reaffirm your renunciation of evil and renew your commitment to Jesus Christ?

*People* I do.

*Bishop* Do you believe in God the Father?

*People* I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
 creator of heaven and earth.

*Bishop* Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?  
*People* I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord,  
who was conceived by the Holy Spirit,  
born of the Virgin Mary,  
suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried;  
he descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again;  
he ascended into heaven,  
he is seated at the right hand of the Father,  
and he will come again to judge the living and the dead.

*Bishop* Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

*People* I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints,  
the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,  
and the life everlasting.

*Bishop* Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking  
of bread, and in the prayers?

*People* I will, with God's help.

*Bishop* Will you persevere in resisting evil, and whenever you fall into sin, repent  
and return to the Lord?

*People* I will, with God's help.

*Bishop* Will you proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ?

*People* I will with God's help.

*Bishop* Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbor  
as yourself?

*People* I will, with God's help.

*Bishop* Will you strive for justice and peace among all people, and respect the dignity of every human being?

*People* I will, with God's help.

*The Designated Lay Person for the Renewal Rite continues to respond on behalf of the people. Others respond while muted.*

*Addressing all lay persons, the Bishop says*

Your ministry as lay persons is to represent Christ and the Church; to bear Christ wherever you may be; and, according to the gifts given you, to carry on Christ's work of reconciliation in the world; and to take your place in the life, worship, and governance of the Church.

Will you continue in this ministry?

*People* I will, with God's help.

*The Designated Deacon now responds on behalf of the deacons. Addressing all deacons, the Bishop says*

Your ministry as deacons is to represent Christ and the Church, particularly as a servant of those in need; and to assist bishops and priests in the proclamation of the Gospel and the administration of the sacraments.

Will you continue in this ministry?

*Deacons* I will, with God's help.

*Bishop* Do you here, in the presence of Christ and the Church, renew your commitment to your ministry, under the pastoral direction of your bishop?

*Deacons* I do.

*Bishop* Do you reaffirm your promise to give yourself to prayer and study?

*Deacons* I do.

*Bishop* Do you reaffirm your promise to look for Christ in all others, being ready to help and serve those in need?

*Deacons* I do.

*The Designated Priest now responds on behalf of the priests. Addressing all priests, the Bishop says*

Your ministry as priests is to represent Christ and the Church, particularly as pastor to the people; to share with bishops in the overseeing of the Church; to proclaim the Gospel to administer the sacraments; and to bless and declare pardon in the name of God.

Will you continue in this ministry?

*Priests* I will, with God's help.

*Bishop* Brothers and sisters, as clergy in the Episcopal Church, we are called to proclaim Christ's death and resurrection, to administer the Sacraments of the New Covenant which was sealed with Christ's blood on the cross, and to care for Christ's people in the power of the Spirit.

Do you here, in the presence of Christ and the Church, renew your commitment to your ministry, under the pastoral direction of your bishop?

*Priests* I do.

*Bishop* Do you reaffirm your promise to give yourself to prayer and study?

*Priests* I do.

*Bishop* Do you reaffirm your promise so to minister the Word of God and the Sacraments of the New Covenant that the reconciling love of Christ may be known and received?

*Priests* I do.

*Bishop* Do you reaffirm your promise to be a faithful servant of all those committed to your care, patterning your life in accordance with the teachings of Christ, so that you may be a wholesome example to your people?

*Priests* I do.

*The President of the Standing Committee addresses the Bishop, saying*

Your ministry, as bishop, is to represent Christ and the Church, particularly as apostle, chief priest, and pastor of this diocese; to guard the faith, unity, and discipline of the whole Church; to proclaim the word of God; to act in Christ's name for the reconciliation of the world and the building up of the Church; and to ordain others to continue Christ's ministry.

Will you continue in this ministry?

*Bishop* I will with God's help. And as your bishop, I too, before God and you, re-dedicate myself and reaffirm the promises that I made when I was ordained. I ask your prayers.

*The Bishop, and Designated Lay, Deacon, and Priest Responders for the Renewal Rite respond together (others respond while muted)*

May God, who has given us the will to do these things, give us also the grace and power to perform them.
