## An Order for Compline

### Novena for an election

*The Officiant begins*

May God Almighty grant us a peaceful night and a perfect end.

*Amen.*

*Officiant* Our help is in the Name of the Holy One;

*People* The maker of heaven and earth.

*The Officiant may then say*

Let us confess our sins to God.

*Silence is kept.*

*Officiant and People*

Almighty God,  
We have sinned against you,  
through our own fault,  
in thought, and word, and deed,  
and in what we have left undone.  
For the sake of our Savior Jesus Christ,  
forgive us all our offenses;  
and grant that we may serve you in newness of life,  
to the glory of your Name. Amen.

*Officiant*

May the Almighty God grant us forgiveness of all our sins, and  
the grace and comfort of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

*The Officiant then says*

O God, make speed to save us.

*People* O God, make haste to help us. Alleluia.

*All* Glory to the holy and undivided Trinity, one God:  
as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

*In unison* **Psalm 31:1-5** *In te, Domine, speravi*

1 In you, O God, have I taken refuge;  
let me never be put to shame: \*  
deliver me in your righteousness.

2 Incline your ear to me; \*

make haste to deliver me.

3 Be my strong rock, a castle to keep me safe,  
for you are my crag and my stronghold; \*  
for the sake of your Name, lead me and guide me.

Keep watch, dear God, with those who work, or watch, or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep. Tend the sick, O Christ; give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous; and all for your love's sake. *Amen.*

O God of mercy, as we live in this pandemic, hear our hearts cry out for the loss of those who will never be mere numbers to us, for they are beloved members of our families.

We also ask you to bless all those now shouldering heavy financial burdens from so great a loss.

In the days ahead, we ask you to wrap loving arms around those whose burden of grief is heavy. You, alone, O God, can turn our mourning into dancing and our grief into joy over the sweet remembrance of our beloved. May you now rest their souls.

We pray that there will soon be a vaccine available to all your people. Through Jesus Christ our-Savior. *Amen.*

### **For People Facing Uncertainty**

God of the present moment, God who in Jesus stills the storm and soothes the frantic heart; bring hope and courage to us all as we wait in uncertainty. Bring hope that you will make us the equal of whatever lies ahead. Bring us courage to endure what cannot be avoided, for your will is health and wholeness; you are God, and we need you. *Amen.*

### **OCT 29 Pray for those who influence public opinion**

Almighty God, you proclaim your truth in every age by many voices: Direct, in our time, we pray, those who speak where many listen and write what many read; that they may do their part in

making the heart of this people wise, its mind sound, and its will righteous; to the honor of Jesus Christ our Savior. *Amen.*

**NOV 2 Pray for discernment**

O God, mercifully receive the prayers of your people who call upon you, and grant that they may know and understand what things they ought to do, and also may have grace and power faithfully to accomplish them; through Jesus Christ our Savior, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. *Amen.*

*The Song of Simeon with Antiphon, said by all*

Guide us waking, O God, and guard us sleeping;  
that awake we may watch with Christ,  
and asleep we may rest in peace.

O God, you now have set your servant free \*  
to go in peace as you have promised;

For these eyes of mine have seen the Savior, \*  
whom you have prepared for all the world to see:

*All repeat the Antiphon*

*Officiant* O God, arise, help us;

*People* And deliver us for your Name's sake.

O God, we have heard with our ears, and our forebearers have declared to us, the noble works that you performed in their days, and in the time before them.

*O God, arise, help us;*

*and deliver us for your Name's sake.*

*O God, arise, help us;*

V. From our enemies defend us, O Christ;

R. Graciously behold our afflictions.

V. With pity behold the sorrows of our hearts;

R. Mercifully forgive the sins of your people.

V. Favorably with mercy hear our prayers;

R. O Son of David, have mercy upon us.

V. Both now and forever promise to hear us, O Christ;  
R. Graciously hear us, O Christ; graciously hear us, O  
Christ.

*The Officiant concludes*

Let us pray.

We humbly implore you, O God, to look mercifully upon our infirmities; and, for the glory of your Name, turn all that is evil from us that we most justly have deserved; and grant that in all our troubles we may put our whole trust and confidence in your mercy, and always serve you in holiness and pureness of living, to your honor and glory; through our only Mediator and Advocate, Jesus Christ our Savior. *Amen.*

*The Officiant concludes*
