An Order for Compline

The Officiant begins

May God Almighty grant us a peaceful night and a perfect end.
Amen.

Officiant Our help is in the Name of the Holy One;
People The maker of heaven and earth.

The Officiant may then say

Let us confess our sins to God.

Silence is kept.

Officiant and People

Almighty God,
We have sinned against you,
through our own fault,
in thought, and word, and deed,

and in what we have left undone.
For the sake of our Savior Jesus Christ,
forgive us all our offenses;
and grant that we may serve you in newness of life,
to the glory of your Name. Amen.

Officiant

May the Almighty God grant us forgiveness of all our sins, and
the grace and comfort of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

The Officiant then says

People O God, make speed to save us.
 O God, make haste to help us. Alleluia.

We also ask you to bless all those now shouldering heavy financial burdens from so great a loss.

In the days ahead, we ask you to wrap loving arms around those whose burden of grief is heavy. You, alone, O God, can turn our mourning into dancing and our grief into joy over the sweet remembrance of our beloved. May you now rest their souls.
