## An Order for Compline

*The Officiant begins*

May God Almighty grant us a peaceful night and a perfect end.  
*Amen.*

*Officiant* Our help is in the Name of the Holy One;  
*People* The maker of heaven and earth.

*The Officiant may then say*

Let us confess our sins to God.

*Silence is kept.*

*Officiant and People*

Almighty God,  
We have sinned against you,  
through our own fault,  
in thought, and word, and deed,  
and in what we have left undone.  
For the sake of our Savior Jesus Christ,  
forgive us all our offenses;  
and grant that we may serve you in newness of life,  
to the glory of your Name. Amen.

*Officiant*

May the Almighty God grant us forgiveness of all our sins, and  
the grace and comfort of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

*The Officiant then says*

O God, make speed to save us.

*People* O God, make haste to help us.

*All* Glory to the holy and undivided Trinity, one God:  
as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.  
Alleluia.

*In unison* **Psalm 31:1-5** *In te, Domine, speravi*

1 In you, O God, have I taken refuge;  
let me never be put to shame: \*

deliver me in your righteousness.

2 Incline your ear to me; \*  
make haste to deliver me.

3 Be my strong rock, a castle to keep me safe,  
for you are my crag and my stronghold; \*  
for the sake of your Name, lead me and guide me.

4 Take me out of the net that they have secretly set for me, \*  
for you are my tower of strength.

5 Into your hands I commend my spirit, \*  
for you have redeemed me,  
O God of truth.

*At the end of the Psalm is said*

Glory to the holy and undivided Trinity, one God:

*Scripture is read*

Come to me, all who labor and carry heavy burdens, and I will  
give you rest. Take my yoke upon your shoulders, and learn from  
me; for I am gentle and humble of heart. Here you will find rest  
for your souls, for my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.

*People* Thanks be to God.

*Officiant and People*

Our loving God in heaven,  
holy is your Name,  
may your reign come,  
your will be done,

Give us today our daily bread.

and deliver us from evil.

*Officiant* God, hear our prayer;  
*People* And let our cry come to you.

*Officiant* Let us pray.

Be present, O merciful God, and protect us through the hours of this night, so that we who are wearied by the changes and chances of this life may rest in your eternal changelessness; through Jesus Christ our Savior. *Amen.*

Keep watch, dear God, with those who work, or watch, or weep this night, and give your angels charge over those who sleep.

Tend the sick, O Christ; give rest to the weary, bless the dying, soothe the suffering, pity the afflicted, shield the joyous; and all for your love's sake. *Amen.*

O God of mercy, as we live in this pandemic, hear our hearts cry out for the loss of those who will never be mere numbers to us, for they are beloved members of our families.

You, alone, O God, can turn our mourning into dancing and our grief into joy over the sweet remembrance of our beloved. May you now rest their souls. Bless all those now shouldering heavy financial burdens brought on by this time.

In the days ahead, we ask you to wrap loving arms around those grieving pandemic losses.

We give thanks for vaccines and pray that they will be efficacious against various strains, that all will gain access, and allay carelessness, fatigue and fears that endanger public health. We offer this prayer in the name of Jesus Christ our Savior. *Amen.*

*Silence may be kept, and free intercessions and thanksgivings may be offered. **Please unmute yourself if you wish to share your prayer aloud. Remember to return your microphone to mute when you have completed your prayer.***

### **For People Facing Uncertainty**

God of the present moment, God who in Jesus stills the storm and soothes the frantic heart; bring hope and courage to us all as we wait in uncertainty. Bring hope that you will make us the equal of whatever lies ahead. Bring us courage to endure what cannot be avoided, for your will is health and wholeness; you are God, and we need you. *Amen.*

*The service concludes with the Song of Simeon with this Antiphon, which is said by all*

Guide us waking, O God, and guard us sleeping;  
that awake we may watch with Christ,  
and asleep we may rest in peace.

*In Easter season, add Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.*

O God, you now have set your servant free \*  
to go in peace as you have promised;

For these eyes of mine have seen the Savior, \*  
whom you have prepared for all the world to see:

A Light to enlighten the nations, \*  
and the glory of your people Israel.

Glory to the holy and undivided Trinity, one God:  
as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be for ever. Amen.

*All repeat the Antiphon*

Guide us waking, O God, and guard us sleeping; that awake we  
may watch with Christ, and asleep we may rest in peace.

*In Easter season, add Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.*

*Officiant* May the divine help remain with us always.

*People* And with those who are absent from us.

*The Officiant concludes*

The almighty and merciful God, Creator, Redeemer and  
Sustainer, bless us and keep us. *Amen.*
